Category: Software One of the things I love most about Android development is that you can get a tiny bit of something done pretty fast with no-frills IDE, just enough to get something running and test out the basic functionality. Of course, if you were to build a game that required a lot of graphics, widgets and other elements it would be better to use a proper Java development platform – but this is for testing purposes. Here’s what I’m talking about: I’ve talked about using Eclipse as an IDE for Android development before, and Android Studio has been around for a while too – but now there’s yet another option for Android Studio users out there. This new platform is called “Fabric”, and as the name suggests, it lets you use the Android mobile phone or tablet development platform to build and test apps. It’s not a full-featured development environment like Eclipse or Android Studio. This is, and I quote, “a command line for developers”. So, if you wanted to use it for building up an Android app, Fabric is probably your tool of choice. So you’ve got an Android app, and you want to keep it always up to date, but you don’t want to have to keep building it yourself over and over. For example, if you’ve got a game that you’re developing and you want to test some features in a local environment. Or perhaps you’ve got a startup app and you’re ready to release it to the real world. If so, then it’s time to look into what I’m about to tell you – that is, about one of the many ways you can ensure that your Android app stays constantly up to date. I’ve written about the concept of Docker and its potential uses in the past. In this post, I’m going to tell you a bit more about it, and why it’s useful for developers. In part 1 of this series, I was talking about how containers are a good way to make sure that your code stays up to date and bug-free. This is especially true if you’re working on a public project that’s open-sourced or if you’re developing a commercial project. Of course, you can also use containers for testing, but they’re not always a good
